Syllabuses and Resources



The old syllabus will remain online until September 2020 and may be used for examinations until the end of the 2020 examining sessions. 2021 onwards will use solely the new syllabus. The new syllabus is currently only available on line.

The current printed **Singing Syllabus** has had an amendment – Grade 8 Tenor List B. Please check the online version for the most up to date version.
